What's in the Cards for Senior Centers?

Joslyn Center promotes healthy aging by providing older adults and caregivers access to multiple resources, education, activities to stav active

independent.

According to Medicine Encyclopedia, "Between 10 and 20 percent of elderly adults in this country currently attend senior centers a least once a year." Senior centers typically attracted those with lower income levels, but that's not the case today with people from all walks life migrating towards more friendships, places to go as a group, meeting other widow/widowers, and finding a sense of belonging and living life to the fullest. (National Council on Aging, 2015).


Research shows that older adults who participate in senior center programs can learn to manage and delay the onset of chronic disease and experience measurable improvements in their physical, social, spiritual, emotional, mental, and economic well-being. There is also a common misconception that older adults who go to senior centers are lonely, poor, and/or impaired cognitively, physically, or both. Senior center participants have higher levels of health, social interaction, and life satisfaction. (NCOA, 2015).

By 2034, the United States is expected to enter a demographic shift where adults age 65+ outnumber children in population—for the first time ever. (U.S. Census, 2018). The older population is becoming more racially and ethnically diverse. Between 2018 and 2060 the share of the older population that is non-Hispanic white is projected to drop from 77 percent to 55 percent (Population Reference Bureau, 2019).

California is a rapidly aging state and needs the support of senior centers to help sustain the livelihood of our aging population. By 2030, it is expected that 20% of Californians will be 65+. Engaging, dynamic senior centers that meet the needs of older adults today and in the future are crucial for communities throughout the country. The needs of older adults are not what they used to be—particularly with a technologically advancing and more mobile society. Senior centers must adapt to these advancements in order to help older adults remain connected and address their needs


