Launched in 2011, Go4Life® is a signature public health campaign by the National Institute on Aging (NIA) to encourage older adults to get active and stay active. It is based on an award-winning, evidence-based exercise guide that is designed specifically for older adults, accommodating physical limitations. You may already be familiar with the research showing that fit older people have a lower risk of diabetes, hypertension, coronary heart disease, obesity, depression, and some cancers than their less fit peers. Physical activity also has been shown to reduce pain and improves function in people with osteoarthritis.

If your life is lacking balance, *Go4Life®* with *Debbie* launches at Joslyn Center four days a week at 8am on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. As a Certified Fitness Instructor, Debbie Chester also leads *Balance Conditioning with Debbie* on Tuesday and Thursday from noon-1pm at \$7 per class. This program focuses on total body and core strength while incorporating balance moves and stretches. It is the perfect way for older adults to improve overall flexibility and strength while increasing their balance and stability.








## A MESSAGE FROM THE WELLNESS CENTER



Hello once again to all of our readers. I hope this *Joslyn Journal* finds you well. When you look at the cover of this issue, what do you see? I see an image of some happy active seniors here at Joslyn Center.

Do you ever look at images like this and think, "I wish I could do that" or "be there," or "be like them." Then maybe you have thoughts like, "I can't do that," or "I'll never be able to do that." Naturally, there are many things that can stop us from pursuing our dreams - a medical situation, lack of resources, etc. And we should all be aware that those issues should be evaluated to find supports or alternatives. We here at Joslyn Center are good at helping surmount these types of obstacles.

But I think many more of the obstacles are in our minds. We may be held back by our own personalities, habits, and beliefs. This is certainly true for me.

On April 16th I started teaching a six-week class here called *Mindfulness Education*. It happens to be a topic with which I am very familiar. Nonetheless, I was fairly worried about it because I haven't taught a class for some time. The worry led me to procrastinate preparing for as long as possible. Finally, reality told me the date was getting closer and I had to get on top of it. So, I pushed through, did the planning, and am now teaching the class. Though it's all felt quite challenging, I did warm up to it! Fear had been holding me back. But be it at work, with friends, or especially with ourselves, when we commit to doing something, we benefit immeasurably by following through.

Although fear is one potential obstacle to many endeavors, there are others. Some are simple, some are complex. One way to view it all is, "go with the flow," while also being smart at the same time. In a self-loving and self-accepting manner, we can take time to see what we're avoiding, step back to fully investigate it, and then maybe come up with some workarounds or new ways to do what it is we would like to do.

I hope we can all *Go4Life*® now, and well into the future!


