You are probably familiar with rebooting your computer, but how about rebooting your brain? Among the Joslyn Wellness Center offerings is **Brain Boot Camp**, a two-session memory training program developed by Dr. Gary Small, Director of UCLA's Longevity Center. This interactive educational program provides participants with lifestyle strategies and tools to keep their brains vital and healthy.

Brain Boot Camp helps define the differences between normal aging memory losses and abnormal functioning. You will learn how the memory works, techniques that can be used to enhance your memory skills including remembering names, lists, etc., and how to create lifestyle changes that can improve your brain health and physical health.

The two-session course is \$5 per person, increasing to \$10 in 2025. To register, please contact the Wellness Center at 760-895-4656 to join the 970 graduates who have taken the class here so far. Beginning next year, a *Brain Challenge* follow-up course is planned. Stay tuned!

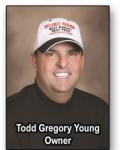

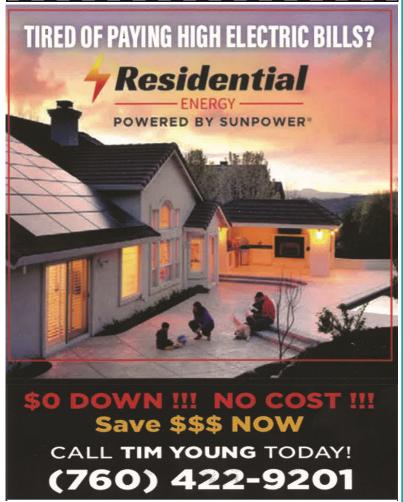

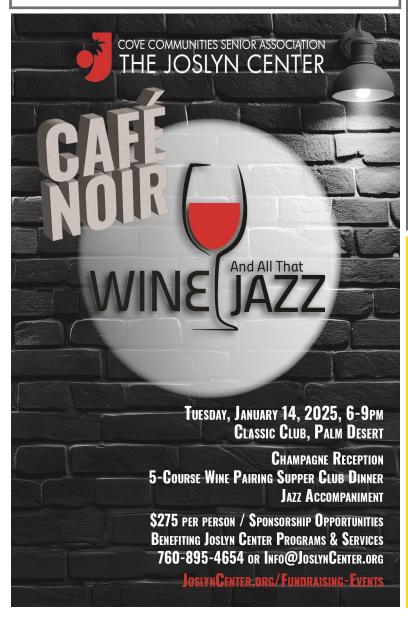
