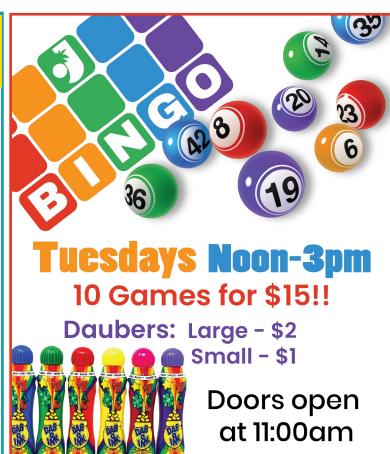

COVER STORY

B-I-N-G-O, and Bingo is its name! It should come as no surprise that one of the most popular activities at Joslyn is the weekly Bingo session on Tuesdays from noon to 3pm, and the doors open at 11am. There are nearly unlimited patterns that may be specified for play. Depending on the number of participants, payouts for each game may range from \$30-\$40 with the final game jackpot ranging from \$175-\$200. Dennis Lubas calls the shots each week and there is often an opportunity drawing as well.

Since it's invention in 1929, modern bingo has evolved into multiple variations, with each jurisdiction's gambling laws regulating how the game is played. In the early 1920s, Hugh J. Ward created and standardized the game at carnivals in and around Pittsburg and Western PA, and copyrighted it and published a rule book in 1933. The game was further popularized by toy merchandiser, Edwin Lowe, after he saw people enthusiastically playing a game called "Beano".

Lowe brought the game to New York where friends enjoyed playing it. The name "Bingo" is said to have derived from a player mistakenly yelling out "Bingo" instead of "Beano". The game, by any other name, would still be a mainstay among senior centers, casinos, and church halls alike. So, come and get your game on and see what all the fun is about!

Welcome to summer season in the desert! The Cove Communities of Indian Wells, Palm Desert, and Rancho Mirage, and the Coachella Valley have experienced extreme heat warnings for the better part of the summer. As temperatures heated up,

the Joslyn Center has been the coolest place in town!

I wanted to take this opportunity to highlight the Joslyn Center as an official Palm Desert Cool Center. It is the place to beat the heat from June 1 to October 15 during business hours. Joslyn opens at 8am and closes at 5pm, Monday-Friday, and is closed on weekends. Individuals who come to the Cooling Center at Joslyn Center are offered a snack and water. The Palm Desert Library is another Cool Center with weekend hours from 10am to 6pm on Saturday and 1-5pm on Sunday for individuals seeking relief from the heat.

In addition to providing a place to escape from extreme heat, Joslyn offers an array of enjoyable, informative, and enlightening activities in a relaxed environment, including Bingo! Members and Cool Center guests are encouraged to enjoy the day at Joslyn Center away from the elevated temperatures. People are encouraged to learn about the innovative programing, friendly social gatherings, health and Wellness Center fitness programs, as well as the information and educational classes.

Additional tips to maintaining your cool are to stay in air-conditioned buildings, not to rely on fans for cooling, limit outdoor exposure from mid-morning to mid-afternoon, avoid direct sunlight, wear loose, lightweight, light-colored clothing, and just take good care of yourself during the heat. It is also recommended to drink twice as much water during excessive heat alerts, and avoid alcohol, caffeine and sugary drinks which do not hydrate your body. In addition, take the time to check on at-risk friends, family, and neighbors at least twice a day, if possible.

As President, my goal is to continue to promote the programs, services, and activities of the Joslyn Center. Over the next few months, I will be taking part in a number of the activities at the Joslyn so I can become more familiar with the programming.

I continue to feel honored to lead such an amazing team and want to acknowledge the Joslyn Center staff who provide the services at the center. They provide a creative, innovative senior center under the leadership of our new Executive Director, Dr. Jay Seller. 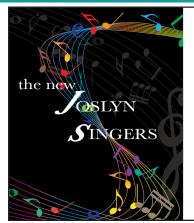
The Sunday Cabaret Series is returning with a talented lineup of entertainment for the new season. The schedule is through December with more to follow in 2025.

The Joslyn Center is a membership organization with annual fees of \$30 for individuals and \$60 for couples. Membership is required to participate in all classes and activities.

The exceptions are social service programs, ticketed Arthur Newman Theatre productions, Brain Boot Camp & Aging Mastery Program, and community health fairs & vaccination clinics.
